Health Spending Plan

The STS Provincial Executive authorized a \$250.00 Health Spending Account for Benefit Plan members. The account is available from July1, 2021 to June 30, 2023. Although the account can be spent over two years, medical bills dated up till June 30. 2022 **must be submitted** by June 30, 2022 to be included in the fiscal year. The remaining amount of the 250.00 will carry over to the next fiscal year. By June 2023, the money needs to be spent. It will not carry over and that will end the Health Spending Plan.

In order to claim the account on the Blue Cross form submitted with the receipts, check the box **Health Spending Account**.
